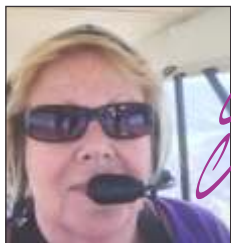

# Flying from an Aircraft Carrier on Lake Tahoe!

**Believe it or not, there is a barge on Lake Tahoe registered with the Coast Guard as an aircraft carrier, but not for airplanes.....for hot air balloons!**


After 4 great flying days at the Great Reno Balloon Race Sept 6th thru 9th, my friend Kathy and I stayed in Gardnerville to meet up with a long-time pilot friend who used to fly for Las Vegas Balloon Rides. Balloon pilot Sheldon Grauberger now flies for Lake Tahoe Balloon Rides. Very early Monday morning (at 3:30am) we drove to South Lake Tahoe, met up with other passengers, then boarded a double decker barge. I have tried to do this flight with Sheldon three different times, but kept getting weathered out. This time the day dawned bright and beautiful, and 35 degrees! After the boat got out a distance

into the middle of the lake, the huge arms were folded out on the top deck. The balloon is very big and much wider than the barge, so these arms kept the balloon from rolling off the sides. Most of you have been around my balloon, in size being 90,000 cu ft, and holding two or three adult passengers and me. This balloon was 260,000 cu ft and the basket held 12 passengers! It actually could hold 16 passengers, but because they deal with density altitude, they only take up 12. There were two flights of 12 passengers and we were on the second flight off the barge. So, yes, the balloon comes back to the lake and lands back on the barge, switched out passengers including Kathy and I, and we were off! We flew low over the lake going south then got over land flying towards Falling Leaf Lake which is about 200 ft higher than Lake Tahoe. By low I mean tree top level. We were able to yell out to people on the ground. Then Sheldon took the balloon up high to about 10,000 ft MSL which took us back over the

middle of the lake. We descended all the way back down to the lake and did a perfect Splash-n-Dash, just barely touching the surface of the lake. Then Sheldon

hovered at about 50 ft and the barge came to us. Sheldon gives the boat captain his direction and speed and the captain lines up the boat with his flight. Like Sheldon says, the boat captain is the real hero in this landing as he maneuvers the barge to us. All Sheldon has to do is come down and land. Nothing like just sitting there waiting for your landing spot to come to you!! The balloon was then deflated and we boated back to the marina. It was an absolutely beautiful experience. The beauty of the lake and the mountains just cannot be matched. I have lots of pictures which cannot be in-



cluded here, but if you want to see more just let me know. If you are ever in the Lake Tahoe area, give them a call (530-544-1221). It is the ONLY balloon ride business in the world from an aircraft carrier! And, it is definitely a "bucket list" item everyone should experience.

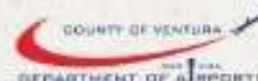

## SCHOLARSHIP ALERT

Each year Amelia Earhart Memorial Scholarships are awarded to qualified members for fully funded advanced flight training, jet type ratings and technical training. Partial funding of \$10,000 per academic year is awarded for academic scholarships. Applications are available now at [ninety-nines.org](http://ninety-nines.org) and are due by 01/01/2019 to the AEMSf Chapter Committee.

And calling all Student pilots! The Spring 2019 fly Now Award is an award of up to \$6000 based on completion of specific training milestones. It is available to Student Pilot Members of the Ninety-nines who meet eligibility requirements. To be eligible, applicants must hold a student pilot certificate, become an official Student Pilot Member by 01/01/2019, log 5 hours total time from 10/18/2018 and show financial need. The Spring 2019 applications are due to the AEMSf Chapter Committee by 04/01/2019.
