




Jennifer Engel received her private on July 20. She flies a Piper Cherokee Warrior out of KSMO.

I signed up Pilots and Paws about a year ago after transporting a border collie to Reno for a woman that Pat M. met at the Waypoint. She was rescued after being cooped up in a cage for too long (that's a story for another time). The challenge I had with future transports for Pilots and Paws was timing, distance or another pilot beating me to the opportunity. It turned out to be a competitive group! Well the day finally came. I was to take 2 Chihuahuas to Henderson NV, where the second pilot would take them to Colorado to their forever home. Departure was to be at 6am sharp so the flights could be completed before the possible afternoon thunderstorms.

At 3:34am a text woke me up – the second pilot needed to cancel. I was sooo disappointed.



(Not to worry – the flight was completed a few days later by other pilots.)

Fast forward two days. I received an email from Bev, the woman to started Savearescue.org, a nationwide shelter and rescue directory, asking

me if I could retrieve a sweet 10 month old German Shepherd named Lexi from Dallas toThousand Oaks. (She must have thought I owned a jet!) I replied with, "I will be in San Antonio for an International 99s Women Pilot Meeting so if you can get her to San Antonio on Saturday, I am happy to transport her on the commercial flight home Sunday morning. All the players sprang into action. Lexi was saved with 2 hours to spare before she would be euthanized. A loving foster family made sure she had her shots,

her required exam and was ready for her flight to CA. Another dedicated volunteer drove her 4½ hours to San Antonio and helped me get her safely on the plane. After an hour in LA trying to find which terminal they took her



to, we were on way to Thousand Oaks, where her new family awaited her with open arms.

So my first Pilot and Paws rescue was one where I didn't even pilot the plane!

You really have to learn to make the aircraft do what you are thinking it should be doing and going where you need it to go. Also, the logical next step after a tailwheel endorsement is aerobatics! I would like to thank my Instructor, Rochelle, for the great training, Judy at CP Aviation for having a great flight school, and the CP Aviation line guys who always have the aircraft ready to go.


